BY THE COMMISSION:

On December 18, 2012, the Commission opened the above-captioned docket, on its own motion, to investigate funding for costs for the development of certain Geographical Information Systems ("GIS") Data relating to the provision of Enhanced Wireless 911 Service. The Commission sought comment from interested parties regarding, among other things, whether funding beyond the allocations provided to the PSAPs through the 911-SAM should be made available for the costs to develop a statewide GIS address point data layer.

A hearing was held on March 20, 2013. On January 7, 2014, the Commission entered an order finding that it did not have sufficient information to reach a decision regarding whether additional funds from the Enhanced Wireless 911 fund should be made available for the development of additional GIS data layers. In particular, the Commission determined there was insufficient information available regarding the costs associated with the development of such GIS data layers and the scope of the project.

On February 14, 2014, additional comments were received by the Commission from interested parties. Based upon the comments filed, the Commission concluded that it was then premature to decide whether additional funding should be provided.

On March 21, 2017, the Commission opened Docket No. 911-061/PI-192, on its own motion, to investigate and review funding, standards and policies relating to GIS data necessary for the provision of Next Generation 911 service and to schedule a workshop. On May 1, 2017, the Commission held a workshop on numerous GIS-related topics such as the potential prioritization of funding for "core" and "recommended" GIS data layers as designated by the National Emergency Number Association, including address point layers.
