BY THE COMMISSION:

The Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission") initiated this proceeding on December 13, 2022<sup>1</sup> to administer federal Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund ("CPF")<sup>2</sup> funding for broadband development in Nebraska pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 81-12,245 and in accordance with the Nebraska Broadband Bridge Act.<sup>3</sup> On January 10, 2023, the Commission released an Order Issuing the 2023 Grant Application Schedule and releasing the Application Materials ("January 10, 2023, Order").<sup>4</sup> On January 18, 2023, the Commission entered an Order scheduling a public workshop. A public workshop was held on January 24, 2023, in the Commission Hearing Room and via WebEx.

Pursuant to the procedural schedule released in our January 10, 2023 Order, applicants were required to submit applications on or before February 24, 2023.<sup>5</sup> Applicants were given an opportunity to modify applications, correct defects in applications, and provide responses to challenges submitted until April 24, 2023.<sup>6</sup> On May 16, 2023, the Commission entered an Order upholding certain partial challenges and denying other partial challenges which it

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determined were not credible.<sup>7</sup> Applicants were then given the opportunity to submit modified applications in response to successful partial challenges on or before June 2, 2023.<sup>8</sup>

### OPINION AND FINDINGS

### Applications Received

The Commission received a total of 130 applications in response to its January 10, 2023 Order. A summary of each application is listed in "Attachment A" to this Order. Consistent with Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1307(1), applications were timely published on the Commission website. The Commission staff reviewed applications for completeness and contacted applicants in the case of any missing information or other defects in the applications. Applications were reviewed in accordance with the weighted scoring system set forth in the Commission's January 10, 2023 Order in this proceeding.<sup>9</sup>

On May 16, 2023, the Commission released an order issuing determinations as to the credibility of partial challenges, and reclassifying the priority tier of some applications.<sup>10</sup> Applicants were given the opportunity to modify their applications as a result of a Commission-determined successful partial challenge.<sup>11</sup> Such modifications were due on or before June 2, 2023.<sup>12</sup> Applications not modified to remove the successfully challenged portions were considered withdrawn.<sup>13</sup> Some applications were withdrawn before

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consideration  $^{14}$  and some applications were reclassified to Priority Tier  $3.^{15}$ 

#### Challenges Received

Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1307, providers were given the opportunity to submit a challenge to an application if the challenger provides broadband service in the proposed project area, has begun construction to provide broadband service in the proposed project area, or provides broadband service in an area proximate to the project area and intends to provide service within the project area within eighteen months. Challenges were due to the Commission on or before April 7, 2023.<sup>16</sup>

The Commission received challenges to 45 of the applications, with some applications receiving multiple challenges. Attachment A to this Order summarizes all challenges received in response to the applications filed in this grant round.

Applicants were notified of any challenges received, and the non-confidential portions of challenges were published on the Commission's website. Applicants were given the opportunity to supplement, modify, or withdraw their application if desired. If an application was subsequently withdrawn by the applicant or modified to remove the challenged portion of the project area, the challenge was considered moot, and those challengers will not be required to meet the obligations for successful challengers.

Challengers were required to designate their challenge in correspondence with the requirements of § 86-1307(2)(a) ("Type 1") and § 86-1307 (2)(b) ("Type 2").<sup>17</sup> Providers submitting a Type 1 challenge attested that they currently provide service at the minimum 100/20 Mbps speed threshold to all serviceable locations within the challenged portion of the project area. Providers submitting a Type 2 challenge attested that they were either currently constructing broadband infrastructure in the project area and anticipated completion of broadband infrastructure providing a

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minimum 100/20 Mbps speed threshold to all serviceable locations within the challenged portion of the project area within 18 months. Some providers submitted separate challenges under both Type 1 and Type 2 categories; in this case, each attestation was considered under its own merits.

Challenging parties whose partial challenges were upheld as set forth in the Commission's May 16, 2023 Order were required to submit attestations as to their commitment to continue providing or deploying service in the challenged area. Attestations were due to the Commission on or before May 23, 2023.<sup>18</sup>

#### Challenges Upheld

Following review of the applications and challenges submitted, the Commission determined that certain challenges, attached hereto in Attachment B, were credible and should be upheld.<sup>19</sup> The challenged projects listed in Attachment B therefore will not be funded.

All successful challengers must submit to the Commission by July 6, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time a Challenger Acknowledgment and Attestation Form, attached hereto in Attachment C, and available on the Commission website. Successful type 1 challengers must attest that they will continue to provide 100/20 Mbps service in the entire challenged area. These challengers will also be required to notify Commission should the challenger's service offerings in the area change.

Type 2 challengers whose challenges have been upheld must attest that they will provide service to the entire project area in question. Any Type 2 challenger listed in Attachment B who does not successfully provide broadband Internet service to the entire project area within eighteen months will not be able to challenge any grant until the 2025 NBBP grant cycle.

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Type 2 challengers must submit documentation to the Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. Central Time on **December 27**, **2024**,<sup>20</sup> demonstrating that the challenger has fulfilled its commitment to deploy broadband Internet service with access to the Internet at the stated speeds in the entire project area. Type 2 challengers are also required to submit to the Commission quarterly progress reports regarding their construction of service in the project area by the fifteenth day of the first month following each quarter, beginning in the third quarter of 2023.<sup>21</sup> The first progress report from Type 2 challengers will therefore be due to the Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. Central Time on **October 15**, **2023**. A sample progress report form is attached to this Order as Attachment D.

### Review of Remaining Applications

Following review of the challenges to be upheld and withdrawn or incomplete applications, the Commission determined that 65 applications should be approved for funding. In cases of significant overlap where both projects were eligible for funding, only the higher-ranked project was funded. In Congressional District One, the Commission finds that projects totaling \$40.3 million in CPF grant funds should be approved in this round. In Congressional District Three, the Commission finds that projects totaling \$21.03 million in CPF grant funds should be approved in this round.

The Commission finds that, upon review of the submitted applications and challenges, each of the applications listed in Attachment E to this order should be fully funded. As previously set forth in this docket, 1/4 of the funds awarded will be processed for distribution upon award of the grant.<sup>22</sup> One-fourth of the funds will be processed for distribution in March of 2024. Following project completion, applicants shall submit all invoices justifying project expenses within ninety (90) days of project

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completion. Upon successful completion of the project, the required speed testing, and invoice submittals to justify expenses, the remaining one-half of awarded funds will be processed for distribution. Final payments may be adjusted based on actual eligible project costs and match percentage.

Each successful applicant shall be held to all requirements of the Nebraska Broadband Bridge Program, as listed in the Act and by order of this Commission. Successful applicants must submit to the Commission a Grantee Acknowledgment and Attestation Form (Attachment F) with the executed Capital Projects Fund Subrecipient Grant Agreement, and the Civil Rights Attestation by July 6, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time. Payments shall not be disbursed to applicants until these executed documents are received.

Generally, each applicant listed in Attachment E must provide to its designated service area broadband Internet service scalable to one hundred megabits per second for downloading and one hundred megabits per second for uploading, or greater, upon project completion. All completion deadlines and repayment requirements set forth in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1304 and in this Order shall apply to each project listed in Attachment E.

Grant recipients will be required to submit quarterly and annual reports to the Commission, on forms provided by the Commission, including construction progress reporting, reporting on financial metrics, and other items to ensure that subrecipients of federal funding comply with federal rules and regulations with respect to federal awards. The reports are due by the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the first month following each quarter. The first report will therefore be due to the Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. Central Time on **October 15, 2023**.

Assuming successful completion of all prerequisite filing requirements, the first payment of grant awards will be processed within sixty (60) days of this Order. Successful applicants must immediately contact the Commission via e-mail sent to <u>psc.broadband@nebraska.gov</u> to verify required documentation for receipt of ACH payments from the State of Nebraska is on file with the Commission.

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### Project Completion and Testing

The deadline for completion of each of the projects listed in Attachment E shall be **December 27**, **2024**. Each applicant must submit to the Commission on or before **December 27**, **2024**, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time a certification that the broadband network described in the application has been completed. A template certification is attached to this order in Attachment G.

If an applicant is unable to complete the project by December 27, 2024, extensions of the deadline may be available upon a showing of good cause pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1304(2)(a). Applicants seeking an extension must submit a request for extension to the Commission by November 30, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time. Applicants seeking an extension must include a detailed explanation of the circumstances and reasons surrounding the request, along with any and all relevant documentation for the Commission's review. Applicants who may need an extension are encouraged to submit a request for extension as soon as possible.

Following an applicant's completion of the project, the applicant shall conduct speed testing as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1304(3) and Commission Docket No. NUSF-133.<sup>23</sup> The number of locations to be tested is as follows:

To the extent possible, grant recipients serving more than 500 locations in a project area should attempt to test at least

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10% of served locations. Locations to be tested must be selected at random, and tests must be performed during times of peak usage. The results of these speed tests must be submitted to the Commission within thirty (30) days of project completion. Speed test results shall be submitted in both a summary and detailed format. A speed test certification form is included as Attachment H to this order.

Should an applicant's testing fail to reflect that the entire project area is capable of being served at the required speeds, the applicant must submit along with speed test results a written proposal to remedy the deficiencies. This proposal must include the date upon which speed testing will be conducted a second time, which must be no later than sixty (60) days following the initial speed testing.

Following successful completion of the project and required speed testing, the final 50% of grant funding will be made available to applicants. Final payments may be adjusted based on actual eligible project costs and match percentage. Applicants must submit to the Commission documentation and invoices necessary to support the project costs no later than ninety (90) days following project completion. A cover sheet for submitting invoicing and documentation is included in Attachment I.

### Submission of Location Data

On June 7, 2023, Treasury updated its Capital Projects Fund Reporting requirements for grant recipients.<sup>24</sup> Among the changes required, recipients are now required to report location specific data using the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC's") standardized identifiers. This includes the FCC's provider number and fabric identification number for every location funded.<sup>25</sup> Due to this change, all grant recipients will be required to report their FCC provider number and the fabric identification numbers of locations included in the approved project area. Such information must be submitted to the Commission by **July 21, 2023** at 5:00 p.m. Central Time, on the form provided by the Commission, so that it can be included in the Commission's progress report to the Treasury. Going forward, reporting the progress and completion of

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buildout to these locations will be a required field in each quarterly report filed with the Commission.

#### Future Grant Rounds

The Commission plans to open an additional window for CPF applications in Congressional District 3 after a comment period to consider modifications to the application and scoring criteria. Projects that were not approved for funding in this round may be resubmitted during a subsequent grant cycle for consideration.

### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the applications listed in Attachment E shall be funded. Each of the applicants awarded shall be required to complete the project by **December 27, 2024**, unless granted an extension by order of the Commission. All successful applicants listed in Attachment E shall be subject to speed testing requirements as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-1304 and as set forth above.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that each successful applicant must submit to the Commission on or before **December 27, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time** a certification that the broadband network described in the application has been completed. Applicants seeking an extension of this deadline must submit a request for extension to the Commission by **November 30, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that disbursement of the grant award shall be conducted as described above. The final disbursement of grant awards shall be conducted following review of submitted documentation of allowable costs, and the amount distributed to each applicant shall not exceed the grant award set forth in Attachment E to this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that successful applicants must immediately verify required documentation for receipt of ACH payments from the State of Nebraska is on file with the Commission. Successful applicants must also submit to the Commission a Grantee Acknowledgment and Attestation Form, an Executed Grant Agreement, and the required Civil Rights Compliance Attestation, as indicated in Attachment F, by July 6, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time.

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Payments shall not be disbursed to applicants until such documentation is received.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that successful applicants must file the location data described above with the Commission no later than July 21, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the challenges listed in Attachment B shall be upheld. Each of the successful challengers listed in Attachment B must submit a Challenger Acknowledgment and Attestation Form to the Commission by July 6, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. Central Time affirming their status as a Type 1 or Type 2 challenger.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that each of the Type 2 challengers listed in Attachment B and any successful partial Type 2 challengers listed in the Commission's May 16, 2023 Order must submit to the Commission quarterly progress reports regarding their construction of service in the project area by the fifteenth day of the first month following each quarter, beginning in the third quarter of 2023, with the first progress report due to the Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. Central Time on October 15, 2023.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that unless an earlier deadline has been required by the Commission in previously challenged areas, the Challengers listed in Attachment B must submit documentation to the Commission no later than 5:00 p.m. Central Time on December 27, 2024, demonstrating that the challenger has fulfilled its commitment to deploy broadband Internet service with access to the Internet at the stated speeds in the proposed project area.
