OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed April 21, 1980, the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska, seeks to discontinue certain party line services.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Attached to the application and incorporated herein by reference are copies of the following proposed tariff sheets:

Seventeenth Revised Sheet E and Nineteenth Revised Sheet F, Local Exchange Service Tariff.

Applicant seeks to discontinue residence 4 party service at Madison and Orchard; residence multi-party service at Orleans and Tilden; and business multi-party service at Ord, Orleans and Tilden. There are presently no subscribers to any of these services in these exchanges.

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.
