OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed April 28, 1980, the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska, seeks authority to eliminate the electronic sentry device from its tariff and restrict the offering of the twin channel automatic warning unit to existing customers.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Attached to the application and incorporated herein by reference is a copy of the following proposed tariff sheet:

Third Revised Sheet 13C, Section II

Applicant seeks to delete from its tariff the offering of the electronic sentry device and to restrict the offering of the twin channel automatic warning unit to existing customers. As of March 31, 1980 there were no electronic sentry units and only one automatic warning unit in service.

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-10 be and it is hereby granted and the General Telephone Company of the Midwest be and it is hereby authorized to revise its tariff to include the sheets set forth in the Opinion and Findings herein.
