OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed March 4, 1981, the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska, seeks authority to discontinue two-party urban service in its Leigh, Orchard, Brunswick and Monroe Exchanges and urban residential four-party service in its Tilden Exchange.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Attached to the application and incorporated herein by reference are copies of the following proposed tariff sheets of its Local Exchange Tariff:

Applicant seeks to discontinue residential two-party urban service in its Leigh, Orchard, Brunswick and Monroe exchanges, along with residential four-party urban service in the Tilden exchange. These services will be discontinued due to the completion of its regrade programs in these listed exchanges. All customers have been notified, and are scheduled to be upgraded to higher classes of service by the end of May.

Applicant also requests permission to remove rates from its tariff for residential multi-party service in the Franklin, Ord, and Stamford exchanges, rates for Service Stations in the Franklin and Stamford exchanges and rates for Business multi-party service in the Franklin Exchange. There are presently no customers receiving any of these services.

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-126 be and it is hereby granted and the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska be and it is hereby authorized to revise its tariff to include the sheets set forth in the Opinion and Findings herein.
