By application filed April 23, 1981, William R. Schatz and Roland E. Schatz, Lincoln, Nebraska, seek a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate as a radio common carrier in Columbus, Nebraska.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. Protests to the application were filed by The Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Company, General Telephone Company of the Midwest and Charles P. Oden dba Nebraska Radio Telephone Systems.

Interrogatories of the applicant were submitted by General Telephone Company of the Midwest and public hearing which had been scheduled on the application was continued to a date to be later determined.

On January 11, 1982, applicant requested that is application be dismissed.
