OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed November 9, 1981, the Clarks Telephone Company, Clarks, Nebraska, seeks authority to adjust rates and change classification of service to its subscribers.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Applicant seeks to revise its tariff to eliminate residence rural four party service at its Clarks exchange and substitute one party service at \$8.00 per month.

It also proposed to increase rates for IMTS Mobile service from \$47.00 per month to \$54.00 per month for 2-channel sets and from \$60.00 per month to \$69.00 per month for all-channel sets and to increase the installation charge to \$100.00. It is also proposed to establish the tiered service connection charges set forth below:

Unit installation charge		5.00
Station wiring charge		7.00

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.
