OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

The order in the above reference docket was granted in part on June 21, 1983, and directed The Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Company to file with the Commission six month trouble indexes for the Firth, Garland, Dorchester, Hallam and Valparaiso exchanges on a quarterly basis until further order of the Commission. The company has provided four such reports with the latest report filed July 30, 1984, for the second quarter of 1984. This report reflected the following six month averages.

Firth	3.26
Garland	3.29
Dorchester	4.32
Hallam	3.33
Valparaiso	2.20

These exchanges have met the Commission objective for the last twelve consecutive months therefore it is the opinion of the Commission that further filing of this trouble report information is not necessary.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that further trouble index information shall not be required and the filings made by The Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Company do comply with the information mandated in the Commission June 21, 1983 order pertaining to trouble indexes in the exchanges of Firth, Garland, Dorchester, Hallam and Valparaiso.
