## OPINION AND FINDINGS

## BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed June 24, 1982, the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska, seeks authority to remove Residential Two-Party urban service from its Palmer exchange.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Applicant seeks to discontinue the offering of residence two-party urban service at its Palmer exchange. There are presently no subscribers to this service and it had previously been discontinued to new customers.
