OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed December 21, 1982, the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska, seeks authority to eliminate residential two-party urban service from the Orleans exchange.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Attached to the application and incorporated herein by reference is a copy of the following proposed tariff sheet:

Thirty-second Revised Sheet F, Local Exchange Tariff.

Applicant seeks to revise its tariff to eliminate the offering of residence two-party service within the base rate area of its Orleans, Nebraska exchange. All current subscribers are receiving one-party service.

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-327 be and it is hereby granted and the General Telephone Company of the Midwest be and it is hereby authorized to revise its tariff to include the sheets set forth in the Opinion and Findings herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file an appropriate tariff sheet with the Commission.
