OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

Pursuant to Commission order entered August 23, 1983, United Telephone Company of the West has submitted for the Commission's approval a schedule of rates and charges for telephone service that will produce additional annual revenue of \$650,149.

Proposed rates by rate groups are set forth on the attached Schedule A, incorporated herein by reference.

The Commission has examined the schedule of rates and charges proposed by Applicant and finds that they conform with the order entered August 23, 1983.

All premises considered, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the schedule of rates and charges for telephone service as set forth in the proposed tariffs submitted and on the attached Schedule A are fair and reasonable, are in the public interest, and should be granted effective September 7, 1983.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission pursuant to the original order entered in Application C-335 on August 23, 1983, that Applicant be and it is hereby authorized to charge and collect the rates and charges set forth in Schedule A attached, all by reference made a part hereof, effective September 7, 1983.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all present rates and charges for telephone service not herein modified, revised, or replaced, be and shall remain in full force and effect.
