OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

On October 3, 1983, the Commission, on its own motion, began an investigation into the availability of intrastate communications service by GTE Sprint and MCI.

Intervention in the proceeding was allowed by AT&T Communications of the Midwest and others. AT&T Communications of the Midwest submitted interrogatories to GTE Sprint and to MCI. GTE Sprint filed objections to interrogatories on March 16, 1984. On March 22, 1984 AT&T Communications of the Midwest filed motions to compel answers by GTE Sprint and MCI.

Oral argument on said motions was held on April 10, 1984. Upon consideration of the motions, arguments of counsel and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the motions to compel answers should be overruled.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Motions to Compel Answers to Interrogatories in application No. C-447 be and they are hereby overruled.
