OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed January 18, 1984, the General Telephone Company of the Midwest, Columbus, Nebraska, seeks authority to eliminate the offering of four-party urban service at Neligh and two-party urban service at Beaver City, Battle Creek and Ord, Nebraska.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

Attached to the application and incorporated herein by reference is a copy of the following proposed tariff sheet:

Local Exchange Tariff:
Thirty-sixth Revised Sheet F, Section I

Applicant seeks to eliminate from its tariff the offering of four-party urban service at its Neligh, Nebraska exchange and two-party urban service at Beaver City, Battle Creek and Ord, Nebraska. There are presently no customers to these services at these exchanges.

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-483 be and it is hereby granted and the General Telephone Company of the Midwest be and it is hereby authorized to revise its tariff to include the sheets set forth in the Opinion and Findings herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file an appropriate tariff sheet with the Commission.
