OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed July 6, 1984, the Plainview Telephone Company, Plainview, Nebraska, seeks approval of the conversion of the remaining multiparty rural subscribers to single party rural service.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest to the application was filed.

On April 1, 1980 applicant was authorized by the Commission to provide single party rural service to customers requesting such service. As of June 1, 1984, 303 of applicant's 356 rural customers had one party service. Some of the 53 remaining multi-party subscribers have requested one party service.

Applicant now seeks authority to discontinue the offering of rural multiparty rural service.

Upon consideration of the application and attending circumstances and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-527 be and it is hereby granted and the Plainview Telephone Company be and it is hereby authorized to discontinue the offering of rural multi-party service.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file appropriate tariff sheets with the Commission.
