OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed October 22, 1984, MCI Telecommunications Corporation, Washington, D.C. seeks a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

On December 17, 1984, AT&T Communications of the Midwest filed its Petition to Intervene. On December 24, 1984 Intervenor propounded interrogatories to applicant.

On January 21, 1985 Applicant submitted Objection to the Interrogatories and requested a protective order. Oral argument was held on the Objection to Interrogatories on February 4, 1985.

Upon consideration of the application, the Motion, arguments of counsel and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the Motion for Protective Order be overruled in part and Intervenor's Interrogatories be allowed. The Commission further finds that no waiver of the provisions of Rule 016.03 of the Rules of Procedure be allowed.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Objections to Interrogatories and Motion for Protective Order in application No. C-552 be and they are overruled in part and Intervenor's Interrogatories be and they are hereby allowed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that waiver of Rule 016.03 of the Rules of Procedure is hereby denied.
