OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed April 8, 1985, Radio Engineering Service, Inc., Omaha, Nebraska seeks a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protest was filed.

Applicant seeks a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to resell the cellular mobile radio service of Omaha Cellular Limited Partnership, Centel Cellular Co., General Partner, in Omaha, Nebraska. The Commission has determined in application No. C-587 that the Federal Communications Commission has pre-empted the authority to issue certificates of convenience and necessity for cellular radio service, thus no certificate of Convenience and Necessity is required.

Applicant has also filed its proposed tariff for resale of cellular service. The proposed tariff conforms with those approved for other companies and should be approved.

As modified above, the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that application No. C-581 be and it is hereby granted as modified and Radio Engineering Service, Inc. be and it is hereby authorized to place in effect the tariff referred to in the Opinion and Findings herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the request for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity be and it is hereby dismissed in accordance with the FCC pre-emption.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file a copy of its tariff with the Commission.
