OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

On November 8, 1985 The Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Company filed its application in which it alleged that its new switching equipment being installed in its territory is capable of a number of optional features which applicant wants to offer its customers in a 90-day promotion beginning December 1, 1985.

The Commission finds that it would be in the best interest of applicant and the public to allow applicant to suspend its service ordering charges under its tariff and conduct special promotions for 90 days after the cut-over of a particular switch. An emergency rate order should be approved pursuant to Section §75-121 R.R.S 1943, as amended.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that The Lincoln Telephone and Telegraph Company be, and it is hereby, permitted to suspend its tariff charge on ordering charges for 90 days after a new switch is cut-over in each exchange in its territory.
