OPINIONS AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed May 12, 1986, Kenneth C. Snyder, dba Radio Communications Company, Fremont, Nebraska seeks a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

Notice of filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.

Upon consideration of the application, and being fully advised the Commission is of the opinion and finds that:

- 1. Applicant is an individual doing business as Radio Communications Company, and has his principal place of business at Fremont, Nebraska.
- 2. He is presently engaged in the sale and servicing of two-way radios.
- 3. Applicant now seeks to provide mobile radio service as a radio common carrier serving subscribers having businesses or residences located within twenty-five miles of Fremont, Nebraska.
- 4. Applicant has received expressions of interest in the service proposed from businesses and individuals in the area.
- 5. Applicant should be limited to two years in which to have its system in operation.
- 6. The application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest, and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that application No. C-655 be and it is hereby granted and Kennth C. Snyder, dba Radio Communications Company be and it is hereby authorized to furnish two-way mobile radio service as a radio common carrier to subscribers having businesses or residences located within twenty-five miles of Fremont, Nebraska.
