OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By order entered September 15, 1987, the Commission denied the application of George Farm Company, South Sioux City, Nebraska for authority to receive telephone service from the South Sioux City exchange of Northwestern Bell Telephone Company.

Applicant appealed this matter to the Nebraska Supreme Court (Case #87-1054). The court has issued its mandate to the Commission that the application be granted.

Section 75-613, Neb. Rev. Stat. as amended requires that the Commission determine the loss of investment to Northeastern Nebraska Telephone Company. Evidence of record establishes this loss of investment to be the sum of \$966.00, determined as follows:

Investment in drops (Exhibit 5)	\$555.
Investment in outside plant*	<u>411.</u>
	\$966.

*Represents 40% of the cost of cable from residences to last subscriber on the line (\$1,040.64, T: page 70)

In accordance with the mandate of the Nebraska Supreme Court, the application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that, in accordance with the Mandate of the Nebraska Supreme Court, Application No. C-739 be and it is hereby granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the loss of investment to Northeast Nebraska Telephone Company be and it is hereby determined to be the sum of \$966.00 and that applicant file with the Commission a receipt showing payment of same.
