OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

On July 25, 1989, ITT Communications Services, Inc. filed a motion to amend the Commission order entered July 18, 1989 in the captioned application to delete the requirement therein that an application be filed for approval of the acquisition of stock by Metromedia Long Distance Co.

Evidence adduced at the June 13, 1989 public hearing established that negotiations were under way concerning the acquisition by Metromedia Long Distance, a subsidiary of Metromedia Corp. of the stock of the applicant from its parent, ITT Corp.

In its motion, applicant states that completion of the proposed transaction is expected within the next 14 days and that further delays could seriously affect the proposed transfer.

Applicant has filed information describing Metromedia Long Distance and its financial condition and has agreed to file a copy of the stock sale agreement.

Upon further consideration of the application, applicant's motion and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and find that the motion to amend should be granted and the Order portion of the July 18, 1989 order in application No. C-771 should be amended to delete the third ordering paragraph.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that motion to amend the July 18, 1989 order in application No. C-771 be and it is hereby granted and the order is hereby amended to delete the third ordering paragraph which required that an application be made to the Commission for approval of a change in controlling interest.
