OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

By its application filed January 17, 1991, Amer-I-Net Services, Old Bridge, New Jersey, seeks to transact the business of a reseller of telecommunication services within the state of Nebraska.

Notice of the filing of the application was published pursuant to the provisions of the Commission's Rules and Regulations. No protests to the application were filed.

Pursuant to notice required by law, public hearing was held on the application on March 19, 1991, in the Commission Hearing Room, Lincoln, Nebraska.

Upon consideration of the application, the evidence adduced at the hearing and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that:

1. Applicant is a corporation incorporated in the state of Delaware with its principal office in Old Bridge, New Jersey. Applicant has been established since November, 1990, and is a non-facility based reseller. Applicant utilizes AT&T and Sprint facilities. Applicant intends to provide 24 hour interstate and intrastate one-plus long distance telephone service. Applicant provides services at or below AT&T and Sprint's rates for similar services except for evening rates.

2. Mr. James C. Watson, Secretary and part owner, testified on behalf of the applicant. While Mr. Watson owns 10% of the company, 80% is owned by Polar Communication, Inc. The President of Polar Communications is Douglas E. Savery. Polar Communications Company is an AOS provider. The applicant will focus basically on small businesses and residential customers as potential clients. Marketing is initiated through sales representatives and telemarketing. Applicant does not function as an AOS zero plus operator. Advance deposits are not required for services rendered by business or residential customers.

3. Applicant filed with the Commission as Exhibit #3 the financial commitment of Polar Communications. Polar Communications has initially put \$75,000 in applicant's capital structure. Applicant is currently doing business in five states.

4. The application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest and should be granted.


ORDER




