By application filed December 30, 1991, The Hogan Company, Bellevue, Washington ("Hogan") seeks authority to operate as a reseller of telecommunications services in Nebraska. The applicant's principal address is listed above in reference to Mr. Dick Pouria's appearance on Hogan's behalf.

Notice of the application was published the Omaha DAILY RECORD January 7, 1992 in accordance with Commission's rules of procedure. No protests application were received. Hearing on the application was held March 10, 1992 in the Commission Hearing Room, Nebraska with appearances as shown.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

BY THE COMMISSION:

Upon consideration of the application, the governing statutes and rules, the evidence adduced at the hearing, and being fully informed in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

The Applicant is a privately held stock company incorporated in the State of Washington in 1989 and is a switchless reseller. The company's president, Walter Hogan, is the sole stockholder. The Applicant resells mostly Sprint and some MCI long-distance services and currently has approximately 7,000 customers nationwide.

The applicant seeks to provide resale interexchange interLATA and intraLATA telecommunications services in Nebraska.

No state commission has rejected an application from Hogan for reseller authority. A formal complaint was filed by Network Communications regarding a billing dispute. The Washington State Public Utilities Commission found in favor of Hogan. The applicant has no customers in Nebraska while the application is pending.

The application contains a copy of Hogan's articles of incorporation and certificate of authority to transact business in Nebraska as a foreign corporation issued by the Nebraska Secretary of State January 8, 1992. No other state regulatory agency has required the applicant to procure a performance bond.

Hogan's tariff is not mileage sensitive. Mr. Pouria testified the rates will be compensatory. The tariff filed with the application is applicable only to interLATA service despite the fact Hogan seeks both interLATA and intraLATA authority. An accurate tariff reflecting this must be filed. Hogan provides several different services:

1. Service Type InterWATS:

InterWATS is a switched access 1+ outbound service. Rates are not mileage sensitive.
Time of day for rating is as follows:

10% Rebate or Discount is provided to residence customers when payments are received witin 20 days of the bill date.

Business amounts are subject to late fees.

Residence Rate periods are 7 A.M. to 6:59 P.M. for day and 7 P.M. to 6:59 A.M. including all day on weekends for evening and night.

Business rates are flat rates for all time periods.

According to the applicant's financial statements, The Hogan Company's balance sheet reflects assets and liabilities of \$1.029 million as of November 30, 1991. Applicant provided an income statement through December 1990. This document shows a total revenue for 1990 of \$4.632 million and a gross profit of After expenses, the applicant's earnings \$1.431 million. before income tax amounted to \$229,501. Considering the relative newness of this company, the figures do not demonstrate a lack of financial fitness.

The applicant's proposed tariff is in accordance with the Commission's rules and regulations. The tariff appears reasonable in light of the proposed service.

Based on the testimony, the exhibits, and the proposed tariff, the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest, and should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-912 be, and it is hereby, granted and The Hogan Company, Bellevue, Washington be, and it is hereby, authorized to operate as a resale carrier of intrastate interexchange interLATA and intraLATA telecommunications services within the State of Nebraska. The Applicant is restricted against providing such service to correctional facilities, jails, and prisons.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant shall file, in accordance with the applicable statutes, an annual report with

this Commission consisting of (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission, (b) the annual report to stockholders, and (c) for the state of Nebraska on a combined interstate-intrastate basis, the investment in telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues, operating expenses, and taxes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Applicant file an updated tariff prior to offering service pursuant to the certificate granted in this order which correctly reflects the Applicant is providing both InterLATA and IntraLATA service and the applicable rates for each.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order be, and it is hereby, made the Commission's official Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to furnish the service authorized herein.
