O P I N I O N   A N D   F I N D I N G S

BY THE COMMISSION

By its application filed February 5, 1992, Communications Services, Inc., Seacaucus, New Jersey, formerly ITT Communications Services, Inc., seeks to amend its certificate to reflect a name change to "Metromedia Communications Corporation," East Rutherford, New Jersey.

Notice of the application's filing was published February 6, 1992 in the Omaha Daily Record per the Commission's procedural rules. No protests to the application were filed.

Prior to re-naming itself Communications Services, Inc., ITT Communications Services, Inc. was granted a certificate to provide interexchange resale of telecommunications services in Nebraska July 18, 1989 (see Application No. C-771). Subsequently on January 28, 1991, the certificate on file with the Nebraska Secretary of State to do business as a foreign corporation was amended to reflect a name change to Metromedia Communications Corporation. By letter dated March 29, 1991, not application, Communications Services, Inc. notified the Commission of the name change and then acted on the assumption the change was recognized by this Commission.

Communications Services, Inc. now seeks to eliminate the ambiguity of these circumstances by petitioning the Commission to officially recognize it as "Metromedia Communications Corporation" while continuing to do business pursuant to the scope of authority granted to its forerunner, ITT Communications Services, Inc.

According to the pleadings, the articles of incorporation were amended to reflect the new name December 24, 1990 and, according to the application, no changes have been made to the corporation's structure, by-laws, officers or directors.

Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application is reasonable, is in the public interest, and

should be granted. The applicant should be ordered to file a copy of the amended articles of incorporation with the Commission and tariff pages reflecting the applicant's new name.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-918 be, and it is hereby, granted. With the name change, the corporate entity holding the authority originally issued in Application No. C-771 shall hereinafter be recognized as **Metromedia Communications Corporation**, East Rutherford, New Jersey.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant file within ten days of this order's date of issuance a copy of the amended articles of incorporation reflecting the name change. Applicant shall also file new tariff pages reflecting the name change. In so doing, the applicant shall specifically make its filing in reference to the C-918 application.




