American Automated Telecom, Inc. of Irving Texas filed its application for authority to operate as a reseller March 30, 1992. Notice of the application was duly published in the Omaha Daily Record March 31, 1992 and the applicant was sent notice of its June 26, 1992 hearing date by the Commission's Executive Director on May 11, 1992. The applicant failed to appear at the hearing. Commission legal counsel sent a letter July 9, 1992 to the applicant inquiring as to its plans for completing its application. No response was received. The Communications Department filed a motion September 30, 1992 to dismiss the application without prejudice and clear the docket.

Upon review and being fully informed in the premises, the Commission finds the motion to dismiss without prejudice should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the motion to dismiss Application No. C-922 without prejudice be, and it is hereby, granted.
