BY THE COMMISSION

Hartman filed notice of its proposed rate increase with both the Commission and the subscribers October 29, 1992. By the end of November, the Commission had received responses from more than five percent of the affected subscribers who sought Commission determination of the rate. Sub(4) of section 75-609.01 states that if this condition is met within the 60 day time frame, the "commission shall notify the company that it will determine rates for the company in lieu of the company's proposed rate change."

On December 21, 1993, Hartman's counsel filed a letter which we will treat as a motion to dismiss the matter. After reviewing the filings and memoranda provided by Hartman's counsel and the Commission's Communications Department and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the motion should be granted and the application dismissed.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ordered that this matter be and it is hereby dismissed.
