O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On November 29, 1994, pursuant to Application No. C-1115, Calls For Less, Inc., dba CFL of North Sioux City, South Dakota, was granted authority to operate as a resale carrier of intrastate interexchange telecommunications services, including operator services, in Nebraska. On January 13, 1999, pursuant to Application No. C-1935, this Commission approved the transfer of control of CFL to ILD Communications, Inc. of Dallas, Texas.

On November 29, 1999, the Commission received a letter from CFL informing the Commission that as of December 31, 1999, CFL will be dissolved as a legal entity and the remaining obligations for unexpired prepaid long distance cards issued by CFL to its current customers will be satisfied by Intellicall Operator Services, Inc., a sister corporation of CFL who was granted operating authority from this Commission in Application No. C-907. Therefore, CFL requests that its certificate be canceled. The Commission is of the opinion that CFL's request should be honored and its certificate should be canceled.


O R D E R
