PRELIMINARY MATTERS

By application filed February 1, 1995, QCC of Overland Park, Kansas, seeks authority to operate as a reseller carrier for intrastate interLATA and intraLATA telecommunication services within the state. Notice of the application was published in the The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on February 3, 1995, pursuant to the rules of the Commission. Hearing on the application was held March 6, 1995, in the Commission Hearing Room, Lincoln, Nebraska, with appearances as shown.

BY THE COMMISSION

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

Upon consideration of the application, the governing statutes and rules, the evidence adduced at the hearing, and being fully informed¹, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

Applicant produced one witness, John P. Cinelli, who testified: He is president of QCC. QCC is a Nevada corporation which is privately held with its principal place of business in Overland Park, Kansas. QCC will not locate staff or facilities in Nebraska in the near future. Applicant seeks to offer alternative operator services. QCC is currently operating in Nebraska carrying interstate traffic, mostly hospitality services in hotels. QCC will offer 1+ dialing, calling cards, and debit cards. Although its primary business comes from hotels, applicant plans to get involved with businesses and also residences. MCI, Frontier, and Tel-Trust would be underlying

carriers. QCC's rates are in the mid-range. In 1994 applicant made a profit of more than \$100,000. QCC markets its services through agents, direct mail, and telemarketing. Eight people are employed to handle customer service calls. QCC uses direct billing and, for the majority of its billing, ZPDI. In Nebraska applicant would probably bill through local exchange carriers. Exhibit 3 shows the financial data for the company. Exhibit 4 is a brochure applicant uses.

Based on the testimony, the exhibits, and the proposed tariff, the application is fair and reasonable, is in the public interest, and should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1153 be, and it is hereby, granted and QCC of Overland Park, Kansas, is hereby authorized to operate as a resale carrier of intrastate interexchange interLATA and intraLATA telecommunications services within the state of Nebraska, including operator services.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant shall file, in accordance with the applicable statutes, an annual report with this Commission consisting of (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission, (b) the annual report to stockholders, and (c) for the state of Nebraska on a combined interstate-intrastate basis, the investment in telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues, operating expenses, and taxes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant file an updated and corrected tariff prior to offering service pursuant to the certificate granted in this order.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that this order be, and it is hereby, made the Commission's official certificate of authority to furnish the service authorized herein as a common carrier.
