PRELIMINARY MATTERS

By application filed July 31, 1995, Operator Communications, Inc., doing business as ONCOR Communications, Inc. of Dallas, Texas, seeks authority to amend its certificate of public convenience and necessity to reflect a name change to OCI. The applicant's principal offices are located at 6707 Democracy Boulevard, Bethesda, Maryland 20817. Notice of the application was published in the Omaha Daily Record, August 1, 1995, in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Procedure. No protests to the application were received. Therefore, we process this application pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure (Title 291 NAC C. 1, Rule 018.03).

BY THE COMMISSION

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

Upon consideration of the application, the governing statutes and rules, the contents of the application, and being fully informed, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

International Telecharge, Inc. (ITI), was granted a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to resell intrastate interexchange interLATA and intraLATA telecommunications service in Nebraska, pursuant to Commission Order C-745. Later, ITI received Commission approval through C-957 to reflect that ITI was operating as Oncor Communications, Inc. In 1994, Oncor again changed its name, through C-1096, to Operator Communications, Inc., d/b/a Oncor Communications, Inc.

Pursuant to the present application, Operator Communications, Inc. requests it be permitted to brand its calls using its acronym, OCI, in addition to Oncor. Based on the contents of the application, the request is reasonable, is in the public interest, and should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1217 be, and it is hereby, granted and the current certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Operator Communications, Inc., of Dallas, Texas to provide intrastate long distance reseller service in Nebraska be, and it is hereby, amended to reflect a change in name to OCI.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall continue to file, in accordance with the applicable statutes, an annual report with this Commission consisting of (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission, (b) the annual report to stockholders, and (c) for the state of Nebraska on a combined interstate intrastate basis, the investment, if any, in telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues, operating expenses, and taxes. This shall be done under the company's new name as reflected by this order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an updated tariff be filed by the Applicant with the Commission and reflect the name change permitted in this order. Any future amendments of the official tariff shall hereinafter reflect the effect of this order. If new articles of incorporation are filed reflecting the name change, a copy of said articles shall be filed with this Commission.
