PRELIMINARY MATTERS

By application filed April 19, 1996, Universal Network Services of Nebraska, Inc. of Newport Beach, California, seeks approval to change its name to Uni-Net. OPINION AND FINDINGS

Upon consideration of the application, the governing statutes and rules and being fully informed, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

Universal Network Services of Nebraska, Inc. was granted authority to provide intrastate interLATA and intraLATA interexchange telecommunications services in Nebraska pursuant to C-1113 on December 20, 1994. No formal or departmental complaints are pending against the company.

The application states the change in name does not involve any change in ownership or the business practices of the company. Further, the company often uses the generic name of Uni-Net for marketing, sales, promotional, and brand name recognition throughout the many states in which it does business.

The name change will not alter the company's day-to-day operations, services or management; therefore, customers should not experience any visible changes by approving this application.

Based on the contents of the application, the request is reasonable, is in the public interest, and should be granted.
