## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On July 25, 1996, an application was filed by the residents of the Cody exchange requesting extended area service to the Valentine exchange. Cody is served by Great Plains Communications (Great Plains), while Valentine is served by US West Communications (US West). The Commission verified that the application had the requisite number of signatures. Notice of the application was published in <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/jheps.com/">The Daily Record</a> on July 30, 1996.

Pursuant to Nebraska Public Service Commission 002.27B2c, US West Communications remitted a point-to-point traffic study showing calling from the Cody exchange to the Valentine exchange. By Commission Rule 002.27B2c, an application must demonstrate that an average of five or more calls are made per customer per month and that more than 50% of the customers have made at least two calls per month to the petitioned The results show the number of calls made per customer, per month from Cody to Valentine, as well as the number and percent of customers who made two or more calls per month Cody to Valentine are sufficient to application further.

On April 1, 1997, pursuant to Commission Rule 002.27B2e, Great Plains filed with the Commission proposed rates to provide two way EAS between the Cody exchange and the Valentine exchange. The proposed EAS additive rate was \$5.00 per residence/business line. Pursuant to Commission Rule 002.27B3, Great Plains balloted the residents in Cody to determine if they were in favor of the EAS proposal. The proposed ballot complied with Commission's Rules and Regulations and was distributed on April 10, 1997. The ballots were to be returned on or before May 15, 1997.

The results of the ballot were submitted to the Commission on May 29, 1997. Of the 192 ballots sent, 148 were returned. 121 ballots were in favor of the EAS proposal and 26 ballots indicated opposition to the plan. One ballot was disqualified.

By Commission Rule 002.27B3b(3), over fifty percent of the subscribers eligible to vote must vote in favor of the plan. In this case, 77% voted to implement extended area service from the Cody to Valentine exchange. Therefore, the request should be granted.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application C-1383 be, and it is hereby, granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Great Plains take action so as to implement the EAS route on or before October 16, 1997.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that Great Plains update its tariff accordingly.
