On September 24, 1996, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission), on its own motion, opened this docket as a generic proceeding to investigate GTE Midwest Incorporated's (GTE) costs in order to establish rates for interconnection, unbundled network elements, transport and termination and It has come to the Commission's attention resale services. initial order establishing this its docket confusion concerning which entities were either parties or eligible to become parties and that such confusion might have the unintended effect of limiting or foreclosing the right of certain telecommunications carriers whose interests would be directly effected by the outcome of these proceedings from participating in the docket. Further, the Commission has been advised by its staff economist and its consultant on cost models that the Commission's Procedural Schedule adopted on December 2, 1997, may not provide sufficient time for the Commission or the other parties in this docket to adequately review, evaluate and comment on the cost information to be submitted by GTE and other parties herein to the Commission hereunder.

It is in the public interest that entities whose interest will be directly affected by the actions of this docket not suffer an unintended penalty by being precluded from participating in this docket. It is also in the public interest that as much relevant information as possible concerning the important matters which are the subject of this docket be presented to the Commission in an orderly and efficient manner, with adequate time for the Commission and other parties hereto to thoroughly and thoughtfully review, evaluate and comment on such information.

Based on the foregoing, the Commission hereby modifies its previous orders in this docket as follows:

- 1. The Commission's Procedural Schedule entered December 2, 1997, should be vacated.
- 2. Pursuant to its authority under Rule 012 of the Rules of Commission Procedure, the Commission hereby determines that GTE plus all entities certificated by the Commission as competitive local exchange carriers, and all entities which

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have an application pending before the Commission to become a competitive local exchange carrier as of the date hereof, are hereby parties to this docket.

- 3. Any party who intends to file a cost model or cost study in this proceeding shall submit such information to the Commission for review by all parties on July 13, 1998.
- 4. All parties, including GTE, are entitled to submit comments and/or testimony concerning any cost information and other relevant matters on September 14, 1998.
- 5. All parties, including GTE, may submit reply comments and/or rebuttal testimony on October 14, 1998.
- 6. After all comments have been filed, the Commission will conduct a prehearing conference by October 30, 1998, at which time the issues of cross examination and discovery will be addressed.
- 7. A hearing will be conducted on the basis of the written comments no later than December 14, 1998.
- 8. All filings shall be in writing, as well as on disk in WordPerfect format.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that GTE and all certificated competitive local exchange carriers, and all carriers who have an application pending before the Commission to become a competitive local exchange carrier as of the date hereof, be, and they are hereby, named parties to this docket.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by the Commission that the procedural schedule and format set forth above be, and it is hereby, adopted and that any previous orders of the Commission inconsistent herewith are hereby vacated.
