BY THE COMMISSION:

By petition dated May 12, 1997, the Communications Department (the Department) of the Nebraska Public Service Commission (the Commission) opened this docket requesting the Commission to revoke the intrastate operating authority of various defendants for failure to file annual reports pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. 86-807 (Reissue 1994). On June 4, 1996, the motion was sustained; however, defendants were given the option to negotiate a settlement in order to be dismissed from the complaint. A hearing was held July 8, 1997, in the Commission Hearing Room for defendants that did not reach a settlement with the staff. No defendant made an appearance at the hearing. On August 5, 1997, the Commission entered an order revoking the operating authority of several defendants.

Primus has filed a motion requesting reconsideration of the Commission's August 5, 1997 order and asks that their Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity be reinstated.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Primus asked this Commission to reconsider its order entered August 5, 1997, as it had filed its annual report with the Commission. Primus filed a stipulation and the applicable administrative fine on September 8, 1997.

Primus failed to comply with our statutory requirements for nearly four months. It was not until its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity was revoked that it fully complied with Nebraska statutes. This behavior is unacceptable. Should Primus submit a late annual report in the future, a negotiated settlement may not be presented as an option.

Nonetheless, as Primus has filed its annual report, paid the applicable administrative fine, and has signed a stipulation admitting to fault, we find the certificate previously issued to Primus should be reinstated. Application No. C-1539 Departmental Complaint 20
