OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed August 11, 1997, Legacy Long Distance International, Inc., (LLD) of Long Beach, California seeks authority to provide intraLATA and interLATA interexchange telecommunications services in Nebraska. Notice of the application appeared in The Daily Record on August 13, 1997. No protests were filed; therefore, this application was administered pursuant to the Commission's Rules of Modified Procedure.

LLD was organized in the state of California as a corporation on September 10, 1996. Applicant has authority to operate in six states and plans to become certificated in three additional states. No state has denied applicant a certificate of authority.

LLD's communications network in Nebraska will utilize existing telecommunications facilities of underlying certificated carriers. The company's name and customer service number are printed on all its bills. In addition, LLD has a toll-free 800 number for customer service, which operates seven days a week, 24 hours a day.

LLD will offer 1+, inward WATS service, operator assisted services and travel card services statewide to both residential and business customers.

Due to the time frame of incorporation, annual financial statements for the previous three years of operations were not available. However, the financial statements presented for the period ending May 31, 1997, reflect that profitability has been achieved.

Interexchange reseller applications are subject to Commission jurisdiction under Neb. Rev. Stat. Sections 75-604 and 86-805 and Title 291 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, Chapter 5, Rule 003.12. From examination of the application filed herein, the Commission finds: 1) Applicant has provided all the information required by the Commission; 2) Applicant has adequate financial resources to provide the proposed service; 3) Applicant possesses adequate technical competency to provide the proposed service; and 4) The application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1606 be, and it is hereby, granted and Legacy Long Distance International, Inc. is hereby authorized to operate as a resale carrier of intrastate interexchange intra-LATA and interLATA telecommunications services within the state of Nebraska.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant shall file, in accordance with the applicable statutes on or before April 30th of each year, an annual report with this Commission consisting of (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission, (b) a copy of any annual report to stockholders, (c) a copy of the latest Form 10-K filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission, (d) balance sheet and income statement for the previous year of operation and (e) for the State of Nebraska on a combined interstate-intrastate basis, the investment in telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues, operating expenses, and taxes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file an updated tariff within thirty days.
