BY THE COMMISSION:

On August 20, 1997, an application was filed by Cox Nebraska Telcom, Inc. (Cox) of Omaha, Nebraska, seeking authority to transfer its assets and activities to Cox Nebraska Telcom II, LLC (Cox II). Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, August 22, 1997. No protests were filed; therefore, we process this application pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

O P I N I O N   A N D   F I N D I N G S

Cox received a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide local exchange service on December 10, 1996, in Application C-1359. Currently, no formal or departmental complaints are pending against Cox. Cox and Cox II are both wholly-owned subsidiaries of Cox Communications, Inc.

The application requests approval for Cox to transfer all of its assets and activities to Cox II. The shareholders and directors of Cox assent to the name change to Cox II for financial and tax reasons. The technical, financial, and managerial fitness of Cox II is the same as Cox. The transfer will have no adverse impact on the public as Cox does not currently serve any customers.

Upon consideration of the application, the governing statutes and rules, and being fully informed, the Commission is of the opinion and finds the application should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application C-1615 be, and it is hereby, granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all Commission files be changed to reflect the change in applicant's name to Cox Nebraska Telcom II, LLC.
