O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

By application filed September 11, 1997, Cox Nebraska Telcom II, L.L.C., (Cox or applicant) of Omaha, Nebraska, seeks authority to provide intraLATA and interLATA interexchange telecommunications services in Nebraska. Notice of the application appeared in The Daily Record on September 12, 1997. No protests were filed; therefore, this application was administered pursuant to the Commission's Rules of Modified Procedure.

On September 22, 1997, the Commission granted Cox's application to transfer all of its assets and activities from Cox Nebraska Telcom, Inc. to Cox Nebraska Telcom II, L.L.C. Applicant is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Cox Communications, Inc., a Delaware corporation, organized on April 11, 1996. Affiliates of Cox Communications, Inc. have been granted authority to operate in five states, with applications also pending in Iowa and Louisiana.

Cox's communications network in Nebraska will utilize the telecommunications facilities of carriers certificated with the Commission. The company's name and customer service number are printed on all its bills. In addition, Cox has a toll-free 800 number for customer service during normal business hours. Outside normal business hours, emergency service is also available.

Cox will offer a full range of 1+ interexchange telecommunications and calling card services statewide to both residential and business customers.

Financial statements submitted by the applicant for the years ending December 31, 1994, 1995 and 1996, indicate that profitability has been achieved.

Interexchange reseller applications are subject to Commission jurisdiction under Neb. Rev. Stat. Sections 75-604 and 86-805 and Title 291 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, Chapter 5, Rule 003.12. From examination of the application filed herein, the Commission finds: 1) Applicant has provided all the information required by the Commission; 2) Applicant has adequate financial resources to provide the proposed service; 3) Applicant possesses adequate technical competency to provide the proposed service; and 4) The application should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1625 be, and it is hereby, granted and Cox Nebraska Telcom II, L.L.C., is hereby authorized to operate as a resale carrier of intrastate interexchange intraLATA and interLATA telecommunications services within the state of Nebraska.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant shall file, in accordance with the applicable statutes on or before April 30th of each year, an annual report with this Commission consisting of (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission, (b) a copy of any annual report to stockholders, (c) a copy of the latest Form 10-K filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission, (d) balance sheet and income statement for the previous year of operation and (e) for the State of Nebraska on a combined interstate-intrastate basis, the investment in telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues, operating expenses, and taxes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file a tariff within thirty days.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that this order be, and it is hereby made, the Commission's official certificate of authority to furnish the service authorized herein as a common carrier.


