## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On April 11, 1997, the Commission entered an order in this docket instituting an investigation into the structure of intrastate access charges. Included in this investigation is the issue of regulating Internet service provider (ISP) traffic. To solicit further remarks, a public hearing, held concurrently with the substantively related issues within Docket No. C-1960, was set for a date later to be determined in the Commission Hearing Room, Lincoln, Nebraska.

A hearing in the matter of <u>US West Communications</u>, <u>Inc. v. ICG Communications</u>, <u>Inc.</u>(ICG), Formal Complaint No. 1266, was set for a date later to be determined in the Commission Hearing Room, Lincoln, Nebraska. At issue in FC-1266 are questions similar to those presented in C-1960 and C-1628. Therefore, the Commission seeks to designate ICG as a party to Docket No. C-1628. Status as a party will allow ICG to further comment, in a more general sense, on issues within their interest and will provide the Commission additional views into a complex regulatory issue.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that ICG Communications, Inc., be, and they are hereby, made a party to Docket No. C-1628.
