BY THE COMMISSION:

- 1. This matter comes before the Commission upon the request filed by Dalton Telephone Co., Inc. (Dalton), and Elsie (Elsie) Communications, Inc., on April 1, 2003, for approval of a modification in the calculation of their earnings.
- 2. In its request, Dalton and Elsie state that they wish to change the elections selected in the filing of their initial NUSF Transition Plan in 1999. At that time, Dalton and Elsie chose to calculate their earnings using a one-year average. Further, Dalton elected to calculate its earnings on a total company basis. On April 1, 2003, Dalton and Elsie requested permission to calculate their earnings on an intrastate basis using a three-year average test period.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

- 3. In the C-1628 Order, the Commission permitted ILECs to utilize a one-year or three-year averaged period for the determination of the ILEC's earnings relative to the calculation of NUSF payments. Although, the Commission will not consider requests such as this lightly, upon review of the particular facts which led to the applicants' request and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds that the request filed by Dalton and Elsie should be approved effective September 1, 2003.
- 4. The Commission further finds that the request of Dalton to change the calculation of its earnings from a total company basis to an intrastate basis should be approved.
- 5. Because of the changes approved herein, the Commission finds that Dalton and Elsie should be granted a two-week extension of time for the submission of the final NUSF-EARN form in order to give Dalton and Elsie an opportunity to file this year's form consistent with this approval. Therefore, the

finalized NUSF-EARN forms for Dalton and Elsie should be due two weeks from the date of entry of this Order.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the request filed by Dalton Telephone Co. Inc. and Elsie Communications, Inc. should be and is hereby granted as set forth herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a two-week extension of time be granted as provided herein.
