BY THE COMMISSION

This application, filed by the residents of the Winside exchange, requests authority for extended area service (EAS) from the Winside exchange in Winside, Nebraska, to the Norfolk, exchange in Norfolk, Nebraska. Winside is served by NebCom, while Norfolk is served by US West.

The application was verified by the Commission staff to have the requisite number of signatures on October 24, 1997. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on October 28, 1997. Usage studies showed that sufficient traffic was carried from Winside to Norfolk to process the application.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

Pursuant to Nebraska Public Service Commission Rule 002.27B2e, NebCom filed a proposed EAS additive for the Winside exchange. The proposed EAS additive was \$10.92 per line to call Norfolk only, or \$14.62 per line to call both Wayne and Norfolk.

Ballots were sent to subscribers on or about April 10, 1998, with responses due no later than May 11, 1998. Of the customers voting for EAS to Norfolk, 115 customers voted no, while 48 customers voted yes. Of those voting for EAS to Wayne and Norfolk, 115 voted no and 79 voted yes.

Since less than 50 percent of the customers voted in favor of the EAS proposal, pursuant to Commission Rules, the EAS plan will not go into effect. Further, according to Commission Rule 002.27B3b, the customer survey for EAS need not be taken again for twenty-four months.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1667 be, and it is hereby, dismissed.

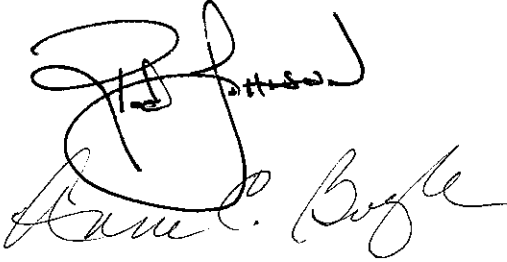
