Comes now, M. Gene Hand, Director of the Communications Department of the Nebraska Public Service Commission, serving the applicant in the above-captioned matter with a request for data.

On November 21, 1997, Cox Nebraska Telcom II, L.L.C. ("Applicant" or "Cox") filed an application with the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) requesting that it be designated an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC) and thus become eligible to receive universal service support under section 254 of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Act). The matter has been scheduled for hearing on February 19, 1998.

The staff issues this request for data to obtain further information in regard to whether Cox meets the minimum statutory requirements to be eligible for designation as an ETC. The hearing previously scheduled for February 19, 1998, should therefore be postponed to a date to be determined to give the applicant the opportunity to respond to this request for data.

To be designated an ETC, the carrier must meet the criteria set forth in 47 U.S.C. 214(e). In relevant part, section 214(e) provides that a carrier seeking ETC status must:

(A) offer the services that are supported by Federal universal service support mechanisms under section 254(c) either using its own facilities or a combination of its own facilities and resale of another carrier's services (including the services offered by another eligible telecommunications carrier); and

(B) advertise the availability of such services and the charges therefor using media of general distribution.

The services supported by federal universal service support mechanisms are set forth in 47 C.F.R. 54.101 as follows:

1. Voice grade access to the public switched network;
2. Local usage;
3. Dual tone multi-frequency signaling or its functional equivalent;
4. Single-party service or its functional equivalent;

5. Access to emergency services;
6. Access to operator services;
7. Access to interexchange service;
8. Access to directory assistance; and
9. Toll limitation for qualifying low-income consumers.

To assist the Commission in processing Cox's application, the applicant is directed to submit supportive evidence or other data to the following requests no later than February 23, 1998:

1. Provide evidence that the services supported by federal universal service support mechanisms, as listed above, are presently being offered.


2. Provide a detailed description of the facilities owned by the applicant that are currently being utilized to provide local exchange service in Nebraska.

3. Submit a detailed description of the services that the applicant provides using the facilities described in Item 2 above.


4. Describe how the applicant advertises the availability of, and charges for, the services provided.

5. Provide evidence that the applicant currently has local exchange customers that are receiving the types of services that are supported by federal universal support mechanisms.
