BY THE COMMISSION:

Comes now the Communications Department of the Nebraska Public Service Commission with the results of the usage study compiled by Great Plains Communications (Great Plains) showing calls made from the Wisner exchange to the Pilger exchange pursuant to Application No. C-1754. The application, filed by the residents of the Wisner exchange, requests authority for extended area service (EAS) from the Wisner exchange in Wisner, Nebraska, to the Pilger exchange. Wisner is served by Great Plains, while Pilger is served by US West Communications, Inc. The application was verified by the Commission staff to have the requisite number of signatures on February 10, 1998. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on February 11, 1998.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

Pursuant to Nebraska Public Service Commission Rule 002.27B2c, Great Plains filed a point-to-point traffic study showing calls made from the Wisner exchange to the Pilger exchange. The traffic study shows calls made from Wisner to Pilger for the three most recent months available. The results show the number of calls made per customer from Wisner to Pilger, as well as the number and percent of customers who made two or more calls per month from Wisner to Pilger.

By Commission Rule 002.27B2c, an application must demonstrate that an average of five or more calls are made per customer, per month and that more than 50 percent of the customers have made at least two calls per month to the petitioned exchange.

In the present application, roughly 23 percent of the Wisner subscribers made two or more calls per month to Pilger. Further, there was not an average of five calls per customer, per month. Approximately 1.9 calls were made per line during this time period. Therefore, the results do not meet the basic requirements set forth in the Commission Rules.

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According to Commission Rule 002.27B2c, if a petition fails to meet the basic criteria, an application will be dismissed without further action. Further, as Application No. C-1754 failed to pass the usage tests established by the Commission, a subsequent EAS petition may not be resubmitted for 24 months, pursuant to Commission Rule 002.27B2d.

After consideration of the application and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds the application should be dismissed for failure to meet the requirements established in Commission Rule 002.27B2d. Further, the Commission finds the residents of the Wisner exchange may not submit a petition for EAS to the Pilger exchange for 24 months pursuant to Commission Rule 002.27B2d.

O R D E R



IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1754 be, and it is hereby, dismissed.



