BY THE COMMISSION:

On March 30, 1998, PT-1 Communications (PT-1), formally PhoneTime, Inc., of Flushing, New York, filed an application seeking to amend its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to reflect a corporate name change. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record on April 2, 1998. No protests were filed. Therefore, we process this application pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

PhoneTime, Inc. received a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide interstate interexchange Telecommunications Services on July 28, 1997, in Application No. C-1527. Currently, no formal or departmental complaints are pending against applicant.

Applicant is requesting the Commission's authority to amend its certificate to reflect the company's change in name from PhoneTime, Inc. to PT-1 Communications, Inc. It has been granted a legal corporate name change in New York, its state of incorporation. Applicant has also received a Certificate of Amended Authority from the Nebraska Secretary of State reflecting the name change.

Upon consideration of the application, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application should be granted.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1786 be, and it is hereby, granted.
