O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

On June 22, 1999, pursuant to Application No. C-1840, Dakota Services Limited of Waukesha, Wisconsin, was granted authority to obtain a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in the state of Nebraska for the purpose of providing high-speed data transmission and other telecommunications services. On January 4, 2000, pursuant to Application No. C-2135, Dakota Services Limited changed their name to @Link Network Inc.

On May 14, 2001, the Commission received a letter from @Link Networks informing the Commission of its desire to withdraw its certificate of operating authority. @Link, cited that under current market conditions and an inability to secure additional financing, they needed to discontinue service in all states. @Link is not currently conducting business in Nebraska, thus, no customer notice is required. @Link has no revenue derived from the state of Nebraska as per the last annual report. The Commission is of the opinion that @Link's request should be honored and its certificate should be canceled.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the certificate of operating authority previously issued in Application No. C-1840 to @Link Networks, Inc., f/k/a Dakota Services Inc., be, and it is hereby, canceled.
