## BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed November 4, 1998, Intercontinental Communications Group, Inc. (Intercontinental) of Delray Beach, Florida, seeks authority to become a wholly-owned subsidiary of Fusion Telecommunications International, Inc. (Fusion). Notice of the application was published in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a>, Omaha, Nebraska, November 5, 1998, pursuant to the Rules of the Commission. No protests were filed.

## OPINION AND FINDINGS

Intercontinental was granted authority to operate as a resale carrier of intrastate interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Nebraska on March 17, 1997, in Application No. C-1421.

Fusion is a privately-held Delaware corporation headquartered in Jersey City, New Jersey. It is not a state-certified telecommunications entity but does hold international resale authority from the Federal Communications Commission.

Intercontinental and Fusion entered into an agreement whereby Intercontinental would become a wholly-owned subsidiary of Fusion. Intercontinental will not merge with Fusion, but rather, Fusion will own 100 percent of the outstanding share of common stock in Intercontinental. Intercontinental will continue to operate as a separate entity.

The transaction will be transparent to Intercontinental's customers in Nebraska. There will be no interruption of service or change in the management or operation of Intercontinental. Intercontinental will not change its name, address, contact information, services, rates, or terms and conditions of service. Intercontinental will continue to market, brand, and bill under the same name.

Based on the evidence, we find the application to be fair and reasonable and in the public interest. The application should be granted.
