BY THE COMMISSION:

On February 2, 1999, GTE Service Corporation (GTE) of Grinnell, Iowa, filed an application to revise the exchange area boundary of the Riverdale and Kearney exchanges. Notice of the application was published in the The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on February 19, 1999, pursuant to the Commission's Rules.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

GTE is a local exchange carrier operating in Nebraska and is subject to the Commission's general regulation of common carriers. Nebraska statutes provide that if the telephone company or companies affected by proposed boundary revisions do not object to the application, the application may be processed by modified procedure. GTE serves both exchanges affected by the change in boundary. Since no protests were filed, the Commission will process the application pursuant to its rule of modified procedure.

The applicant attached a map showing the proposed placement of the boundary between the Riverdale and Kearney exchanges. That map is attached hereto as Attachment A and made a part of this order.

Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds the application should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-1998 be, and it is hereby, granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that GTE Service Corporation submit revised boundary maps to the Commission within 30 days from the date of this order.
