## BY THE COMMISSION:

US West Communications (US West) of Omaha, Nebraska, filed an application on March 30, 1999, to revise its boundary maps between the Omaha Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) and Gretna exchanges. Specifically, US West requests a boundary change in order to supply an existing customer with additional voice and data lines. Currently, there are no facilities in the Gretna exchange which can meet the needs of the customer. The company has agreed to change the boundary to include the customer's location in the Omaha service area. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record on April 1, 1999, pursuant to Commission rules.

## OPINION AND FINDINGS

This application is governed by Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-612 and 75-613 (Reissue 1996). These statutes provide that if the telephone company affected by the proposed boundary revisions does not object to the application, the application may be processed by modified procedure. In this case, no protests were filed. Therefore, this application has been administered pursuant to the Commission's modified procedure rule.

The applicant submitted a map showing the proposed boundaries. US West has consented to the proposed revisions. Through the boundary change, the customer's costs for provisioning of additional services will be reduced.

Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised, the Commission is of the opinion and finds statutory requirements have been met. Application No. C-2024
