O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

The complaint in caption seeks an order revoking the intra-state operating authority of each of the defendants for failing to file an annual report pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. sec. 86-807 (Reissue 1994).

A copy of the complaint was mailed to each defendant via certified mail on May 26, 1999.

The defendants are telecommunications companies generally regulated by the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. secs. 75-101 et seq. (Reissue 1996) and 86-801 to 86-811 (1998 Cum. Supp.). These companies are also governed by Title 291, NAC Ch. 5 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations.

As part of its regulatory authority and pursuant to Section 86-807, the Commission, through its Communications Department (Department), requires telecommunications companies to file an annual report with the Commission on or before April 30th of each year.

The defendants were notified by the Department two times by first class mail that the annual report was due on or before April 30, 1999. The first letter was dated January 8, 1999, and the second April 1, 1999.

The Commission, by order dated June 22, 1999, subsequently determined that a number of defendants had adequately complied with the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. sec. 86-807 and had satisfactorily submitted an annual report for the year 1998. Therefore, those defendants were dismissed from this complaint and are not required to appear before the Commission for a hearing on August 3, 1999.

The Commission finds that two of the defendants did in fact satisfy the filing requirements and were included in the complaint in error. The following defendants should thus be administratively dismissed from the complaint:

Corporate Calling Services, Inc.
GTE Midwest, Inc.

The following defendants have signed a stipulation with the Department wherein each defendant admits to filing its report late and agrees to pay an administrative fine to dismiss the departmental

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complaint. The signed stipulations are satisfactory and the following defendants should be dismissed from this complaint:

The companies listed in the preceding paragraph should be aware that this Commission will not tolerate similar behavior in 2000 regarding the filing of the 1999 report. If reports are not postmarked on or before April 30, 2000, the option of resolving the complaint through a stipulation will be closely scrutinized. All companies that have agreed to such a stipulation will be considered a willful violator and be subject to the maximum penalty allowed.

The above-named defendants have complied with the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. sec. 86-807 and have satisfactorily submitted an annual report for the year 1998; therefore, those defendants should all be dismissed from this complaint and should not be required to appear before the Commission for a hearing on August 3, 1999.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that all defendants who have not been dismissed from this complaint are to appear before the Commission for the scheduled public hearing on August 3, 1999, at 11:00 a.m. in the Commission Hearing Room, 300 The Atrium, 1200 N Street, Lincoln, Nebraska.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any defendant who has filed a satisfactory annual report may execute a stipulation with the Department similar to that offered to the above-named companies for dismissal.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that ACSI Local Switched Services, Inc.; Claricom Networks, Inc.; Comdata Telecom. Svc., Inc.; Corporate Calling Services, Inc.; The Furst Group, Inc.; GTE Midwest, Inc.; LDM Systems, Inc.; Network Plus, Inc.; Quest Telecommunications, Inc.; RSL COM PrimeCall, Inc.; RSL COM U.S.A., Inc.; and TelTrust Communications Services be, and they are hereby, dismissed from the departmental complaint and need not appear at the August 3, 1999, hearing.
