OPINION AND FINDINGS

On August 10, 1999, the Commission entered an order in this docket revoking the certificates of operating authority for all defendants named therein for failing to file annual reports with the Commission as required by  $\underline{\text{Neb. Rev. Stat}}$ . sec. 86-807 (Reissue 1994) and by the Commission's Rules and Regulations, Title 291, Chapters 1 and 5.

On August 23, 1999, defendants Protel Advantage, Inc. dba Long Distance Savings (Protel), Coleman Enterprises, Inc. dba Local Long Distance (Coleman)(collectively, the defendants), filed timely motions for reconsideration, requesting the Commission reconsider their August 10 decision to revoke their certificates of operating authority.

On September 14, 1999, the Commission denied the motions for reconsideration. However, the Commission held its order in abeyance for 10 days from the date of the order, during which the defendants were allowed to comply with several conditions set forth in the order. Upon satisfaction of the stated conditions within the 10-day period, the Commission would agree to grant the defendants' motions for reconsideration and restore the defendants' certificates of operating authority.

The defendants, as stated in the September 14 order, were required to sign and submit to the Commission the necessary stipulation, and were required to pay the appropriate administrative fine. Both Protel and Coleman have satisfactorily complied with these conditions. Therefore, pursuant to the terms of the September 14 order, the Commission is of the opinion the defendants' motions for reconsideration should be granted and the certificates of operating authority should be restored.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the motions for reconsideration of Protel Advantage,
Inc. dba Long Distance Savings, and Coleman Enterprises, Inc. dba
Local Long Distance be, and they are hereby, granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Protel Advantage, Inc. dba Long Distance Savings, and Coleman Enterprises, Inc. dba Local Long Distance be, and they are hereby, reinstated to do business in Nebraska pursuant to their original certificates of operating authority.
