BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed April 5, 2000, PT-1 Long Distance, Inc. (Applicant) of Flushing, New York, seeks authority to operate as an interexchange carrier of telecommunications services within the state of Nebraska. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on April 6, 2000. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Applicant is a Delaware corporation and has received authority to conduct business in Nebraska from the Secretary of State. Applicant is a wholly-owned subsidiary of PT-1 Communications, Inc., which in turn is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Star Telecommunications, Inc., a company publicly-traded on the Nasdaq market. Applicant has been granted authority to provide telecommunications services in 19 states and intends to gain certification throughout the country. In no instance has an application been denied.

Applicant proposes to offer switched access "1+" long distance telecommunications services suitable for voice and limited data applications throughout the entire state of Nebraska. Applicant is a non-facilities-based carrier in Nebraska and will utilize the facilities of MCI WorldCom and other existing certificated carriers. Applicant filed evidence demonstrating sufficient financial ability.

Interexchange reseller applications are subject to Commission jurisdiction under Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-604 and 86-805 and Title 291 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, Chapter 5, Rule 003.12. From examination of the application filed herein, the Commission finds applicant has provided all the information required by the Commission, possesses adequate financial resources to provide the proposed service, and possesses adequate technical competency to provide the proposed service. The application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-2262 be, and it is hereby, granted and PT-1 Long Distance, Inc. is authorized to operate as an interexchange carrier of telecommunications within the state of Nebraska.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant shall file, in accordance with the applicable statutes on or before April 30th of each year, an annual report with this Commission consisting of: (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission; (b) a copy of any annual report to stockholders; and (c) a copy of the latest Form 10-K filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission. If these are not available, applicant shall submit a balance sheet and income statement for the previous year of operation, as well as the investment made in telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues and expenses, and taxes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, to the extent applicable, the applicant shall comply with all laws pertaining to, and all rules and regulations promulgated under, the Telecommunications Relay System Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-1302 to 86-1307) and the Nebraska Telecommunications Universal Service Fund Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-1402 to 86-1410).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant file its current tariff prior to offering service pursuant to the certificate granted in this order.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that this order be, and it is hereby made, the Commission's official certificate of authority to furnish the service authorized herein as a common carrier.
