BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed June 27, 2000, Single Billing Services, Inc., d/b/a Asian American Association (AAA) of El Monte, California, seeks authority to transfer control to New Global Telecom, Inc (NGT). Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on June 28, 2000. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

AAA received authorization to operate as a reseller of interexchange telecommunications services in Nebraska on November 4, 1999, pursuant to Application No. C-2122. NGT, a Delaware corporation located in Golden, Colorado, is an international facilities-based carrier that provides voice and data services worldwide.

NGT and the sole shareholder of AAA have entered into an agreement whereby NGT will acquire 100 percent of the issued and outstanding stock of AAA.

The proposed transfer of control of AAA meets the Commission's standards for granting approval of such a transfer. The acquiring entity, NGT, is financially qualified to assume control of AAA. Also, NGT's team of officers bring a solid record of experience in the telecommunications industry to AAA, and NGT's worldwide operations are also evidence of its technical abilities. Finally, the transaction is in the public interest because it will allow NGT to achieve significant economies of scale, and thus improve its ability to compete and will also provide AAA with access to the financial resources needed to provide improved service to Nebraskans.
