## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On October 7, 2003, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) opened the above captioned docket pursuant to a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) order granting state commissions 90 days to rebut the presumption of "no impairment" as it affects enterprise market switching in an individual state.

The rebuttable national presumption, as provided by the FCC, was that local circuit switching for business customers served by high-capacity loops would no longer be required to be made available as a unbundled network element (UNE.) The FCC described this as an "enterprise market" and found that competition in these enterprise markets would not be impaired if the local switching UNE were unavailable.

The Commission, under this docket, indicated it would only proceed with a review if a competitive local exchange carrier (CLEC) filed a petition and evidence indicating that Commission consideration is required. No petitions were filed.

In light of the decision by the Court of Appeals of the District of Columbia<sup>2</sup> which vacated the FCC delegation of authority to state commissions over impairment determinations for mass market switching, such review is now moot.
